Club Linus

FTMS-E is pleased to announce the formation of a fun and rewarding volunteer student service project called "Club Linus." Club Linus started about three months ago by teachers Erin Carr and Stephanie Dodd (club sponsors). Together Erin and Stephanie envisioned a group of students working together on a volunteer service project at FTMS-East by making and distributing homemade blankets. The vision for the club was to provide love, a sense of security, warmth and comfort to children who are seriously ill, traumatized, or just perhaps in special need of a new, handmade blanket.

Starting a project like "Club Linus" with no budget could have been challenging, but the idea quickly turned into an attainable dream. Just as the saying goes, "Teach a man to fish..." these teachers quickly taught a fairly large group of volunteer students (initially about 30 students and still growing) how to design and make handmade blankets. The club's student volunteers have identified themselves as FTMS-East's "blanketeers" with the primary purpose of providing blankets to comfort young children or teens that are going or recently have been through an unfortunate experience. The Club's volunteers distribute these blankets to children in hospitals, shelters, or social service groups who know a child or teen that might benefit from a big hug and the warm of a blanket.

During the first couple of meetings, Club Linus student volunteers met and discussed problem-solving strategies and blanket-making ideas. They came-up with some ways to generate money to purchase blanket materials. (The average fleece blanket costs about \$18 to make.) The club has shown the student volunteers the importance of leadership, respect, and compassion and everyone has gained additional responsibilities in time management, cooperation and concern for others. Student participation is growing and everyone continues to learn valuable volunteer skills by discussing new fundraising ideas and uncovering creativity skills for making different


blanket designs. The students enjoy working in small groups to plan, organize, and generate creative blanket designs and plan future fundraiser ideas.

FTMS-East students and sponsors are proud and extremely fortunate to have this group working together to selflessly help others. Our group continues to look for volunteers to help with every facet of creating, making, delivering the blankets and also dollars to continue to fund our cause. To date, we have purchased fleece with the funds raised from student spirit days, but are constantly looking for new projects to fund our sources. 

The middle school years can be a challenging transition not only for students, but also for parents. Your school counselors are here to help with that transition. Although your middle schooler is becoming more independent and is increasingly involved in activities outside the family, you should and must remain the most influential person in their life. Through your involvement in school and extracurriculars, you can do much to help your child believe in the value and importance of education, be enthusiastic about learning, and achieve academic success.

As counselors, a big part of our job is to help parents support their children emotionally as well as academically. Here is our best advice for parents of preteens:

- Help your child manage homework time. Encourage her to aim high and always do her best work.
 Check with teachers to see how much time should be necessary to complete homework. See what your school offers to help you help your child, such as an agenda planner or some other homework reminder system, and/or a Web site with helpful links.
- 2. Show interest in his studies by talking with him daily about what he's learning and doing in school (don't take "nothing" for an answer!). If you know your child has a project for science, get involved. The same goes for cheerleading, sports, and music any extracurricular activities.
- 3. Discuss ideas and feelings about school, studies, and activities. Be realistic about what your child can and should be able to do. Don't expect great grades or high test scores if she isn't capable. That expectation will only cause unnecessary frustration.
- 4. With your child, read and review the information that schools and districts provide. Be familiar with course offerings, student handbook, etc. All these will help you and your child successfully weave your way through the maze called middle school.
- 5. Contact counselors, administrators, and teachers periodically. Find out what your child should be learning, how she is progressing, and how you can help. Be a full partner in your child's education.
- 6. Be sure that he attends school on a regular basis. Even if he is absent for illness or another valid reason, he needs to keep up with his studies. Call the school if your child will be missing a day, and find out what he needs to do to make up for it.
- 7. Encourage her to pursue interests and make friends through extracurricular activities. Be certain, however, that she selects no more than a few activities so she has adequate time for schoolwork. You must help her find a balance; this will take compromise and patience.
- 8. Know his friends. Who does your child hang out with? Follow up on any suspicions that you may have. It is better to be safe than sorry at this time of his life. Know where your child is at all times. Be clear and consistent with discipline.

- 9. Make it clear that she must follow school rules and policies. Teach her to respect people as well as property. Help her know right from wrong and what she must do when negative peer pressure come her way.
- 10. Encourage him to get to know his counselor and to maintain contact throughout his middle-school years, if possible. Not only will the counselor be invaluable in supporting his academic path, he's also one of many potential adult role models for your child.
- 11. Attend parent meetings, open houses, PTC, and other activities for parents. I mentioned this before, but it is very important for your child!
- 12. Volunteer at school. Both your child and the school will benefit from your involvement and help. FTMS East is always looking for volunteers to help in a variety of ways.
- 13. Consistently acknowledge and reward efforts at school. Many parents expect the school to provide the incentives for their child's accomplishments. While East does have a lot of motivation programs, parents need to recognize their child's successes too. When your child works hard, your acknowledgment motivates him to persist.

None of us are perfect and we sometimes make mistakes in raising our children. But your child needs your love and respect. She needs to become independent, responsible, and self-sufficient to succeed in most of her endeavors in school and at home. The best way to help her in all aspects of development is to try to ensure that her emotional needs are consistently met. Your understanding, common sense, adult judgment, and good sense of humor can make these middle-school years a joy for both you and your child

Check-Out Procedures

To ensure the safest possible environment here at East the following policies apply when a student is being picked-up during school hours:

"Students leaving school during the school day must sign out in the main office in the presence of parent/guardian with a valid picture ID (e.g. driver's license). A record will be kept of the student's name, date, the time leaving school, and the time the student returns to school."

Under no circumstances will a student be released to an adult not listed as a students' guardian or emergency contact in Infinite Campus, even if requested. To add a name to your child's emergency contact list please contact the front office (803-8100) or fill out the form on the next page and return it to the front office.

Residency and Educational Rights

If your family is in an extreme living situation such as: living in a motel, car, campsite, shelter, temporary housing, combined housing, public places, etc. you could qualify for a McKinney-Vento (homeless) Act.

Please contact your school counselor to discuss ways we can possibly help support your situation. Students who are in homeless living situation have the following rights:

Immediate enrollment in the school they last attended or the school in whose attendance area they are currently staying even if they do not have all the documents normally required at the time of enrollment;

Access to free meals and textbooks, Title 1 and other educational programs, and other comparable services including transportation;

To attend the same classes and activities that student in other living situations also participate in without fear of being separated or treated differently due to their housing situations.

Any questions about these rights can be directed to your school's Counselor.




